#### Gospel: John (6: 1-15)

*Jesus gave out as much as was wanted  
to all who were sitting ready.*

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee – or of Tiberias – and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover.

Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so

many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.

\* **ADDENBROOKE'S HOSPITAL CHAPLAINCY:** Please contact the Chaplaincy Office directly on (01223) 217769 to inform them of any Catholic family members who may have been admitted to ensure that they are registered as a Catholic, and that the patient has ticked the box giving permission for the Catholic Chaplain, or a member of the Chaplaincy Team to visit. In case of emergency, please ask the staff nurse to contact the Catholic Chaplain on duty.

**+ MARRIAGES:** From 1 July 2021 civil marriages will be permitted to be held outdoors on Approved Premises. This change is in respect of civil marriages only. The law in respect of religious marriages remains unchanged, they must take place in certified places of worship what are also registered for marriage. Furthermore, Canon Law states: “A marriage between Catholics or between a Catholic Party and a non-Catholic baptised party is to be celebrated in a parish church. It can be celebrated in another church or oratory with the permission of the local ordinary or parish priest. The local ordinary can permit a marriage to be celebrated in another suitable place. A marriage between a Catholic party and a non-baptised party can be celebrated in a church or in another suitable place”. Diocesan Ordinaries have the faculty to permit the celebration of marriages, in limited circumstances, to take place “in another suitable place” but these are always in other Christian buildings.
